We have the **System**, the **CCISC**, the **COMPASS**, and the **Science**. Now...how do we connect to the **Service** and put evidence-based services into **practice**?

Consistency is essential in *any* profession. What if information *and* the treatment of diabetes were different from physician to physician? What if the *science* never reached the *service* delivery? Where is the credibility with inconsistency? Why would any person follow treatment recommendations that vary so widely?
